A BILL

To limit the use of funds to conduct first-use nuclear strikes, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "The Nuclear First-
- 5 Strike Security Act of 2025".

1	SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON USE OF FUNDS TO CONDUCT FIRST-
2	USE NUCLEAR STRIKES.
3	(a) Limitation.—No amounts authorized to be ap-
4	propriated for any fiscal year may be obligated or ex-
5	pended to conduct a first-use nuclear strike unless—
6	(1) the President decides the strike is in the
7	best interests of the United States; and
8	(2) except as provided in subsection (b), not
9	more than 7 days before conducting such strike, the
10	Secretary of Defense submits to the Speaker of the
11	House of Representatives, the Minority Leader of
12	the House Representatives, the Majority Leader of
13	the House of Representatives, the Minority Leader
14	of the Senate, and the Majority Leader of the Sen-
15	ate a certification that the decision of the President
16	under paragraph (1) to conduct the strike is valid
17	and legal.
18	(b) Exceptions.—Subsection (a)(2) does not apply
19	with respect to a first-use nuclear strike conducted—
20	(1) under a declaration of war enacted by Con-
21	gress;
22	(2) in response to a nuclear attack against the
23	United States or an ally of the United States; or
24	(3) during a launch-on-warning scenario.
25	(e) Definitions.—For purposes of this section:

1	(1) The term "ally of the United States" means
2	a member of the North Atlantic Treaty Organiza
3	tion, Japan, the Republic of Korea, and the Com-
4	monwealth of Australia.
5	(2) The term "first-use nuclear strike" means
6	an attack conducted by the United States using nu-
7	clear weapons against a foreign country in any in-
8	stance where the Secretary of Defense and the
9	Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff have not joint
10	ly confirmed to the President that the foreign coun-
11	try has conducted a nuclear attack against the
12	United States or an ally of the United States.
13	(3) The term "launch-on-warning scenario"
14	means a situation in which the United States early
15	warning systems have detected a launch of a missile
16	whose trajectory would result in an impact on the
17	territory of the United States or an ally of the
18	United States.
19	(4) The term "nuclear attack" means that one
20	or more nuclear detonations have occurred on the
21	territory of the United States or an ally of the
22	United States.
